While initially focused on America's World War II veterans, Honor Flight Network has expanded its mission to include those who served during the Korean War, the Vietnam War, and veterans of any service era who are critically ill.

Transporting approximately 22,000 veterans annually, Honor Flight Network has flown nearly 275,000 veterans to Washington, D.C. since its inception.

The tradition is usually enacted on the first day of Rosh Hashanah but since this day coincides with Shabbat this year the ceremony is moved to day II.
