Message from your President - Simon Newman



This month's President's message is NOT a request for monetary donations. However, I am enlisting each of you to accept an important role in generating funds for our synagogue by promoting Foodie Cards.

Foodie Cards are decks of 54 cards that provide \$10 off meals at 52 different restaurants and two other

entertainment venues. The restaurants are on both the east and west sides of Cincinnati, downtown, and Northern KY. The 2017 version of the decks, which are available now, sells for \$30, with an expiration date of December 31, 2017. However, we still have inventory of the 2016 decks, expiring December 31, 2016, which now are on sale for the rock bottom price of \$10.00. The synagogue receives 50% of the purchase price from each sale. The advantage of selling Foodie Cards is that we receive them on consignment. There are no up-front costs to the synagogue, and any decks we do not sell can be returned to the company. I am pleased to report that as of this writing, fourteen members have sold 95 decks and generated over \$1,000 for Etz Chaim. The math indicates that if each congregant commits to selling at least two Foodie Card decks, our fundraiser will be successful. However, I am encouraging you to accept my challenge of selling at least five decks.

Undoubtedly, selling Foodie Cards is a very simple task. Ultimately, the decks will sell themselves because after using only three of the cards, the buyer has made back his/her investment. Explain to your family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers that these decks of cards are perfect gifts for all occasions such as birthdays, holidays, anniversaries, congratulatory events, and as an expression of gratitude.

Further, we have an exclusive arrangement with the Foodie Card Company insuring that Etz Chaim is the only seller in Cincinnati. This lack of competition will be a major factor in amassing sales.

Russ Rosen has generously agreed to coordinate this fundraising effort. Please contact him at (513) 490-8511 or russell.rosen@gmail.com to request a couple of Foodie Card decks or accept my challenge of selling five decks. If for some reason you are unable to sell your decks, you can simply return them to Russ.

Although I do not want to exert any pressure on our congregants, I truly believe that if everyone participates in this endeavor, the returns will be gratifying. Thus, while our potential rewards from selling Foodie Cards are great, without our congregants' assistance, it is just that...potential.



Ritual Matters

Ritual matters at any synagogue are ongoing and there's never much of a break in the action for us. The next months will prove even more intensive as we turn our focus towards the High Holy Days. More on that below.

Shavuot, the days last June where we celebrated God's special gift to us, the Torah, is always a great holiday and we thank Candy for leading the Tikkun Leil, Chava for the table learning display on the 12 tribes, Hank for leading services and everyone who participated in the celebrations.

We continue to pursue leads for us to hire a Pastoral Care Provider for Etz Chaim. This is an important job and we cannot rush the decision to find someone.

We are currently reviewing a Gabbai Guidelines document which will discuss rules and duties inherent to being a Gabbai. This document will be sent to all current and projected Gabbaim and a copy will remain on the bemah for reference.

Tisha b'Av begins Saturday evening, August 13. Etz Chaim's program and service will start at 9:30pm. After a Havdalah service to end Shabbat, we will enjoy a multi-lingual audio/visual tour through the historical events that happened on Tisha b'Av. It will be followed by a short service in the chapel and Eicha reading. We hope you will attend this solemn but enriching evening.

The RITCOM has started planning for the High Holy Days. Some initial dates to remember:

- --Selichot Saturday evening, September 24, 2016. Plans include a movie, dessert and services. We will also have an educational session as an alternative to the movie.
- --Rosh Hashanah Sunday evening, October 2 through Tuesday day, October 4
- --Shabbat Shuvah Saturday morning, October 8
- --Kol Nidre/Yom Kippur Tuesday evening, October 11 through Wednesday evening, October 12
- --Sukkot/Simchat Torah Sunday evening, October 16 through Tuesday day, October 25

Barry, Barbara and Hank, along with Cantor Lubin - who we are happy to say is joining us again for the Holy Days - have been meeting to work on details. Additional information will be shared in the next bulletin but we have every intention of recreating and even surpassing last year's successful High Holy Day season.

In order to keep our Shabbat services on schedule, the RITCOM has decided that at certain times, we will chant the Heicha Kedusha for service Amidah, reserving judgement to have a Full Amidah at Musaf only as time allows. We also decided that the RITCOM or its Co-Chairs must be consulted to review any special services (i.e. Sisterhood Shabbat, Men's Club Shabbat, Hazak Shabbat other) to assure consistency.

Saturday Night, August 13, 2016 - 9:30pm

This flyer is about a holiday you may not know a lot about or that perhaps you've never really connected to in the past. The holiday doesn't get a lot of great publicity because we can't serve latkes and jelly donuts and it doesn't have a Seder plate. The holiday is Tisha B'Av (the 9th day of the Jewish Month of Av). Tisha B'Av is a fast day and mourns the destruction of the First and Second Temple as well as additional infamous events that occurred throughout history on that day (ie: Bar Kochba rebellion, the first crusades, Warsaw Ghetto liquidation, Argentinean bombing in '94 etc)

Perhaps a sad, fast day doesn't really sound like your "thing" – we understand that. Often times we're asked - why should I care about the destruction of a Temple in 586BCE when I live in Cincinnati in 2016. It's a fair question. I think if you reflect for a moment, or talk to a congregant who has been to Israel - every stone has a story, every section of land has a past. Tisha B'Av marks the moment our lives were altered.

So if you decide to come to the synagogue on Saturday Night, August 13 at 9:30pm here is what can you expect. We'll be parking on the office side of the building. We'll be doing Havdallah, the ceremony that ends Shabbat and transfers us from holy time to mundane time. Then we will travel back through time on an audio/visual tour of the events said to have happened on Tisha B'av.

The tour will guide you through the first floor of our building. No socializing, no levity, just a walk to calm your thoughts and slow the world down, even if only for a moment. Along the way you'll hear the voices of nine fellow congregants in their native languages describing the impact of this day.

Following the tour we'll sit inside our darkened chapel and by candle light we will hear the Book of Lamentations chanted. It has a sad melody and even if you can't follow along in the Hebrew, the tune transcends words and will make the meaning clear. And then the night will end.










































