Fall Offerings

June was a busy month for Education programming! We began with a beautiful Shabbat in the Park on June 7, when the d'var and study session focused on celebration and protection of Nature in the Jewish tradition, followed by a wonderful potluck picnic lunch. The theme of caring for Nature was continued with a tour of the Cincinnati Recycling & Reuse Hub on June 18, when those attending learned more about the do's and don't's of curbside recycling, and how to utilize the CR&R Hub to recycle items that Rumpke does not accept. On June 28, a discussion around the book "Here All Along..." by Sarah Hurwitz offered the opportunity to engage with our fellow congregants in examining a number of "Big Ideas" fundamental to Judaism. The wide-ranging discussion touched on topics such as "Why choose Judaism?"; "What is Judaism?" (A religion? A culture? An ethnicity? A set of values?); "What is the core animating idea of the Torah?"; "Is the Torah constant or evolving?"; How do the concepts of Tzedakah and Hesed play out in your life?"; "Which of the many Jewish conceptions of God resonates for you?". The conversation was engaging and thought-provoking, and might serve as the starting point for future conversations around Judaism's "Big Ideas".

The Education Committee is busy planning for programming in the New Year 5786. We have several programs in the works, and welcome your suggestions. About Chazzan Don Stolper


